

Working group on indicators

Working group specification

Overview and purpose

In deepening Interact's cooperation with the Evaluation and European Semester Unit, Interact has an informal working group on Indicators who help bring practical experience to exchanges.

The objective is to facilitate exchange between experienced evaluation officers, and the Evaluation and European Semester Unit to ensure the specificities of Interreg are well considered in the determination of the common indicator frameworks.

The group was established in various evaluation themed events in the run up to the agreement on common indicators for the 2021-2027 period. The group was successful in bringing knowledge and experience and helping to shape the common indicators. The group has continued to meet at the request of the Evaluation and European Semester Unit.

Entry criteria

There is no formal qualification, but advanced knowledge and experience in programme and project evaluation, and the use of indicators is essential. Additionally, a pro-active approach, and the ability to contribute to the discussion is required.

The working group is not a learning environment, no working time is used to teaching basic level information which is available elsewhere.

Current members have joined the informal group over a number of years. New members are still welcome, so long as the knowledge level is correct and the pro-active approach is observed. If the group becomes overly large, it may need to be capped.
