
# What living repository means in practice?

- Overarching presence across programming periods
- Filters to customize queries and readymade statistics
- Source of regularly updated data and documents that can be used for capitalisation &
- 4 Fields to fill and/or look out for capitalisation in practice



# Overarching presence across programming periods

Keep.eu covers all the financing periods starting in the year 2000 and includs NEXT and IPA countries (excluded in the current Kohesio database).



#### Selected filters:

- All programming periods
- Lead Partner
- Project Partner
- Thematic focus
- Country



### What qualitative and quantitative data mean in practice

- Numeric data about projects, partners and call readily aggregated
- Project descriptions, outputs, results
- 42 themes to group together projects from across programming period
- Project keywords



# Filters and readymade statistics

Aggregated keep.eu data

Can be tailored to individual needs through filters on the left and data export on a spreadsheet, table or chart (as an image).



#### **Overall figures**

Includes data about programmes, projects, partnerships, themes, aggregated partner budgets per NUTSO (country) and per programming period.



#### Figures for population and area

Includes data about partnership total budget per capita, per NUTSO (country) and per programming period.



#### Cooperation among countries and regions

Includes data about cooperation among countries (projects in common).



#### Other interesting charts

Includes data about the number of projects, partnerships and relative budget sizes per theme.

# Fields to fill and look out for regarding capitalisation

#### Four fields to consider


Overall data in keep.eu in general and four fields embedded in keep.eu to support capitalisation in particular.

- 1. Project linkages
- 2. Prizes and mentions
- 3. Results
- 4. Documents and attachments



#### **Project linkages**

Project linkages tell about the relations between projects e.g. precedent/subsequent projects.



### **Prizes** and mentions

Prizes and mentions tell about prizes that the project might have won/the good practices it might have provided.



#### Results

Results in keep.eu are called expected/actual achievements. When the project is still active they are called expected achievements. Once the project has been finalised the expected achievement will subside to make place for actual achievements.



### **Documents** and attachments

We collect publicly available project outputs (documents) such as manuals, reports, booklets and videos.


