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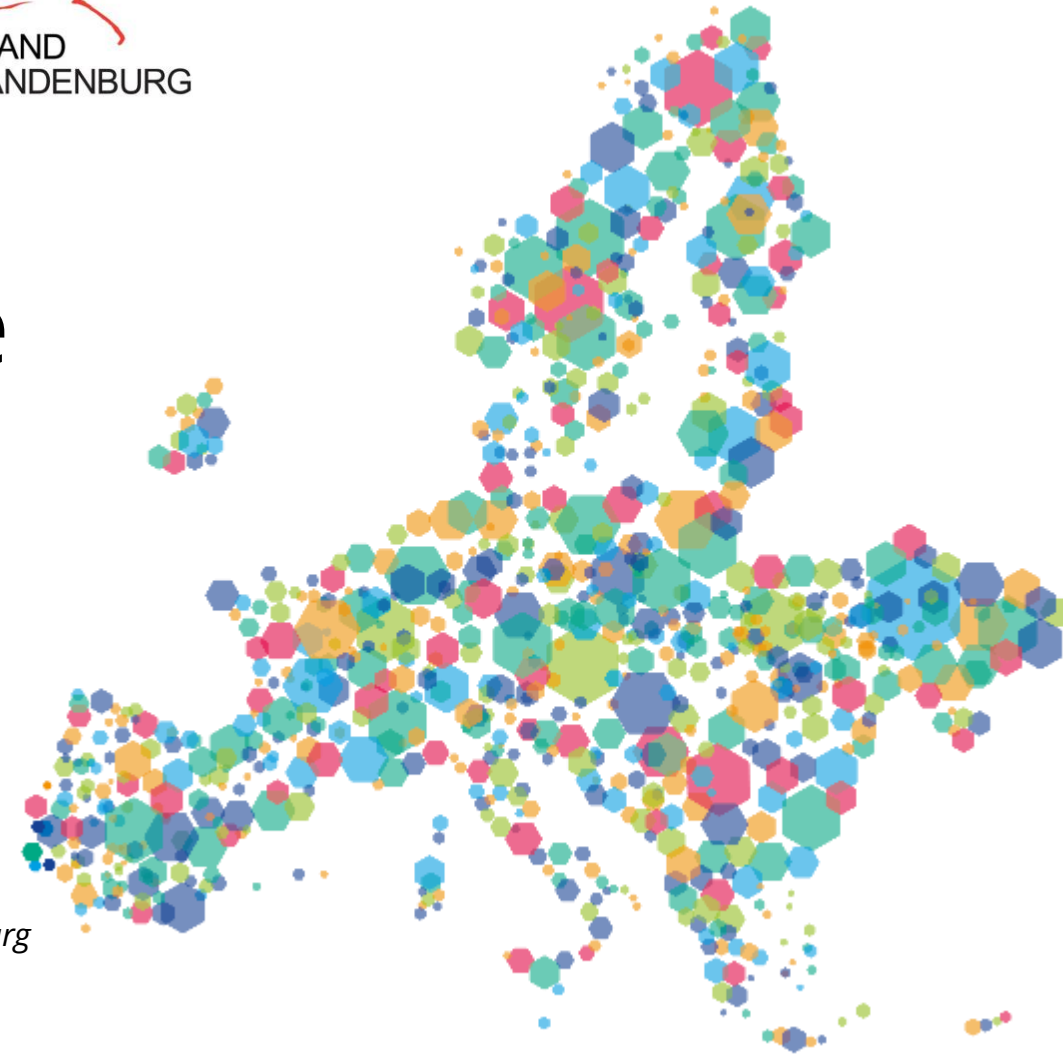

# Interreg Europe **OBJECTIVE**

To improve **regional development policies**  
(including Investment for jobs and growth goal programmes)

## **How?**

Through exchange of experience, innovative approaches and capacity building (in relation to the identification & transfer of good practices)

- Primarily dedicated to **policymakers**
- Focus on **exchange of experience**



Different from cross-border or transnational cooperation

# Focus on **mainstream**: unique feature of Interreg Europe

Objective of improving **mainstream programmes** always present



2000-2006 – topics for cooperation (including Objective 1 & 2)



2007-2013 – ‘Capitalisation projects’: transfer practices into mainstream programmes



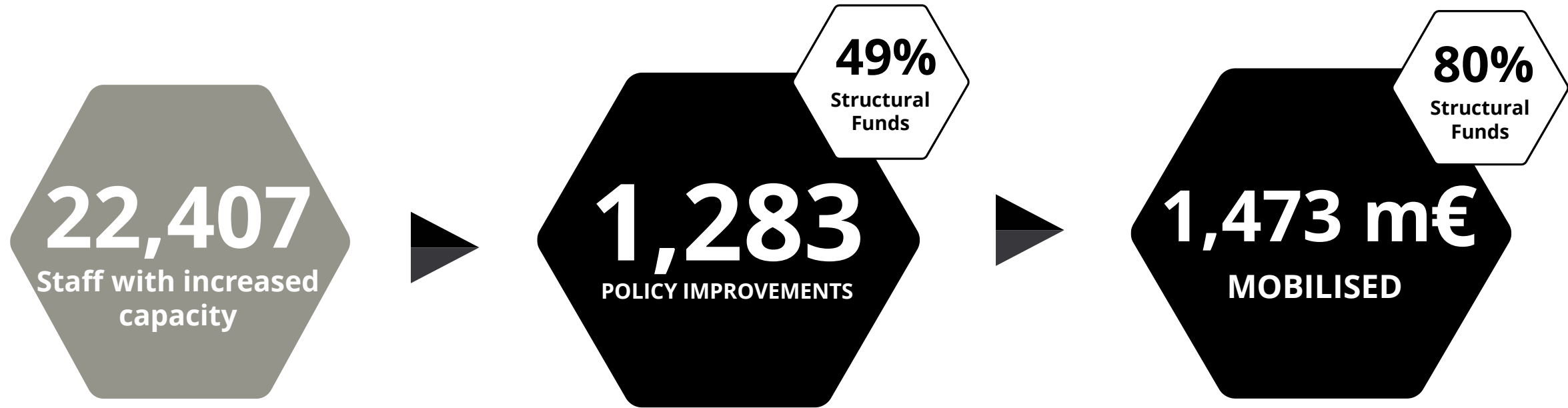
2014-2020 – min requirement for all project to focus on mainstream programmes

## 2014-2020 **achievements**

- 258 projects addressing **1,704** policy instruments
- **78%** are IGJ goal programmes
- In **33%** of the cases, MAs/Intermediate bodies are partners
- **98%** of projects mix more with less advanced regions

# Interregional cooperation works!

258 projects supported during the 2014-2020 period



90% of NUTS2 regions represented:  
51 % come from more developed regions  
9 % from in transition regions and

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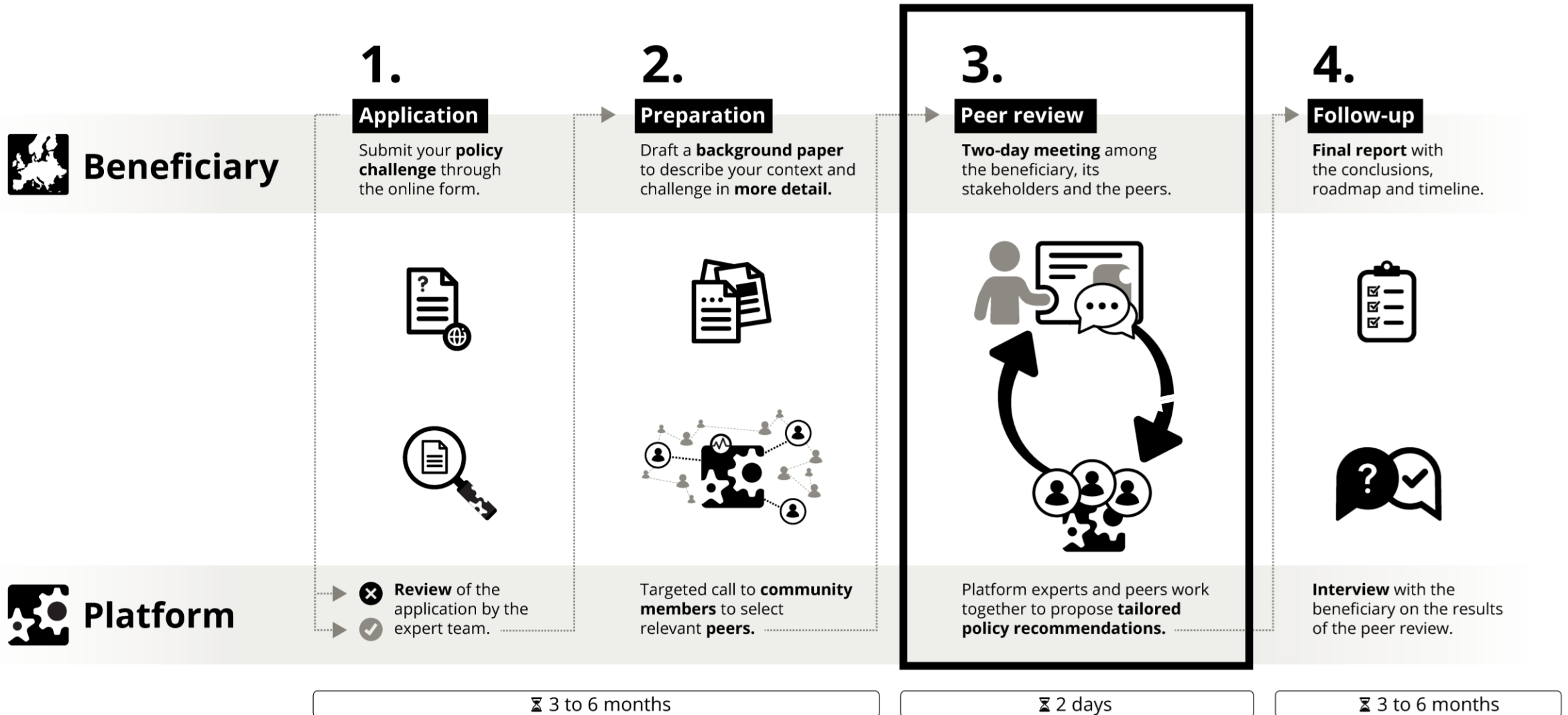
## Why embedding cooperation ?

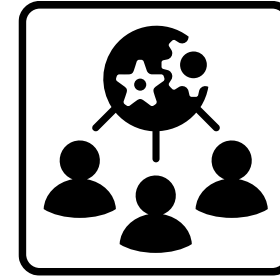
- **Internationalisation a key principle for all EU Funds in Brandenburg (i.e. business, innovation)**

  - Strategic cooperation with Western Poland - Oder Partnership
  - Strategic partnerships with regions in the Baltic Sea Region
- **All funding measures include options to conduct transnational projects**
- **Strong demand for INTERREG funding**
- **How can we further promote projects in the field of innovation?**

# **Three strategic questions** for the peer review

- **How to structure ERDF-support mechanisms for interregional innovation support ?**
- **How to better provide regional stakeholders with the necessary support to engage in interregional projects**
- **How to support SMEs to engage in interregional and/or international R&D&I projects?**

# Peer review **step-by-step**





## Peer review **KEY FEATURES**

- Careful preparation of all participants (host, peers)
- In-depth thematic exchanges over two days
- Opportunity for stakeholder involvement
- Onsite or online – adapted agenda and format
- In the host region or in one of the peer regions

# The elaborated recommendations – an excerpt

- **Long-term political support and roadmap**  
(data gathering to build evidence-base; bottom-up regional dialogue ... )
- **Systematic policy planning and stakeholder coordination**  
(human and financial capacities for cooperation; permanent structure and networks ... )
- **Enabling conditions and experimentation**  
(pilot projects; learning through regular evaluations; let decision-makers experience cooperation ... )
- **Identification, onboarding and capacity-building of beneficiaries**  
(challenge-driven workshops to identify needs and opportunities; support during all phases ... )
- **SME engagement through intermediaries and European networks**  
(diversifying funding paths for SMEs; synergies between funding instruments; storytelling ... )

# The follow-up

## Host reflections and next steps

- **Peer review kicked-off new discussions on how to improve our efforts for interregional cooperation in the field of innovation**
- **New drive for stakeholders to participate in interregional projects**
- **Discussions at the Vice-minister level**
- **Next steps:**
  - Discussion with different directorates of the regional government
  - Dialogue with intermediate bodies how to adapt our funding measures for the 2021-2027 period
  - Further projects in the group of peers
- **The peer review helped us to learn from the best and disseminate best practice examples to improve our daily work**

direct communication with line ministries how to solve obstacles
- **Strategic communication with partner regions**  
along value chains of the clusters of our regional innovation strategy
- **Conference with partners from PL of the Oder partnership**

- **Work towards synergies between ESIF and Horizon Europe**  
Conference with German stakeholders in October in Brandenburg

# Example: Interact – systematic planning

## Interact Guidelines on Cooperation under IJG Goal 2020+

Follow Interact's eight steps to set up a cooperation approach under IJG (pages 40-41) – [Link to the publication](#)



1. Compilation of needs and assessment of requirements
2. Outline specific advantages and design the approach
3. Definition of strategy and goals
4. Definition of the concept, methodology and procedure
5. Drafting the approach and its features
6. Set up internal administrative procedures
7. Approach's specific procedures and implementation
8. Project implementation and follow-up

# Example: Basilicata Region – funded project

## URGES - URBAN GREEN SHAPES. Quality, efficiency and wellbeing of the neighbourhood

**Project budget: EUR 300,000.00**

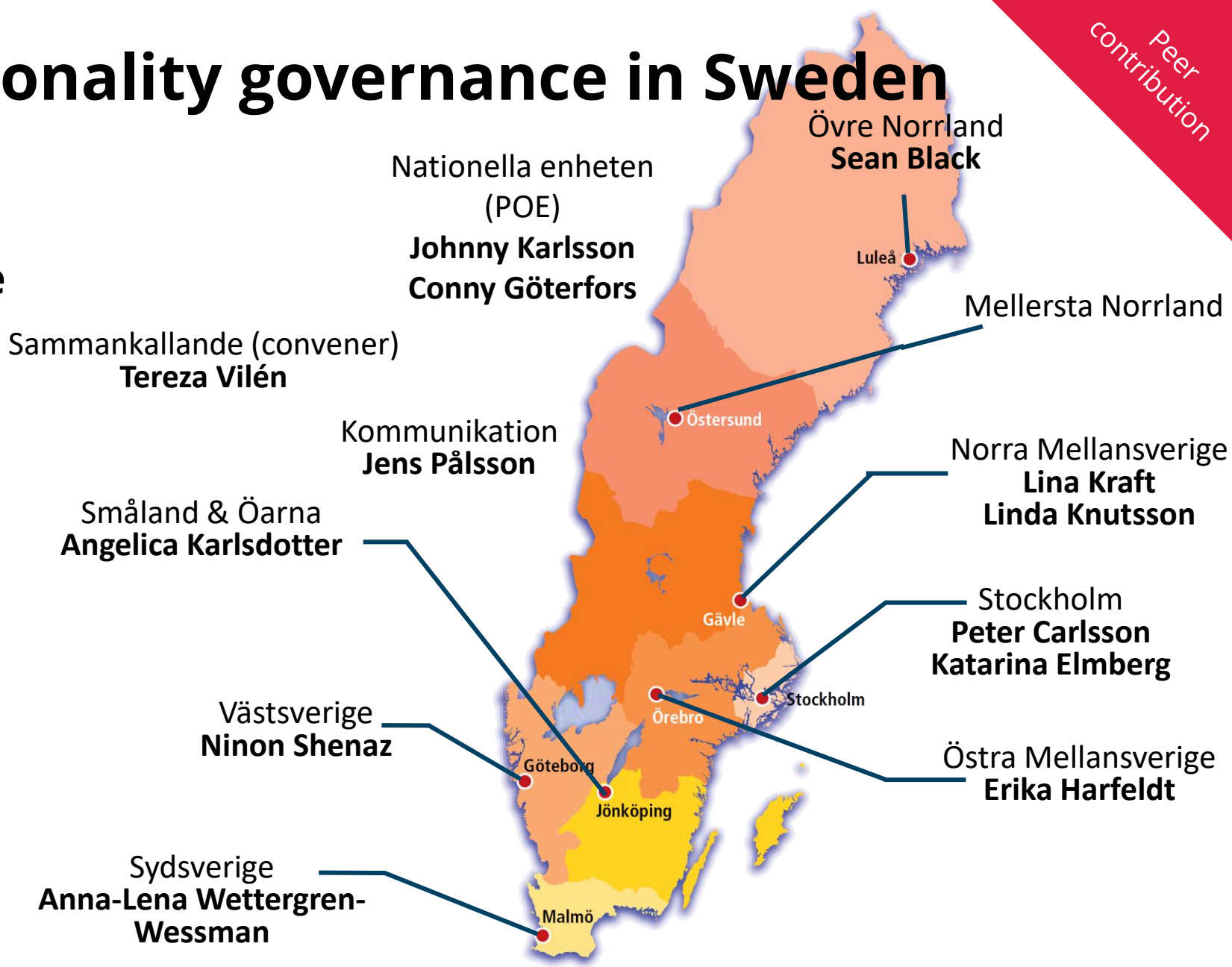
1. **PARTNERSHIP:** 5 partners of which 1 EUSAIR area (EUSAIR pillar: environment quality):
  - Regional Agency for Agricultural Development and Innovation of Basilicata
  - 4 universities: Chieti-Pescara, Reggio Calabria, Sevilla and Ljubljana
2. **OBJECTIVE:** The project aims to favour the wellbeing of the neighbourhood by developing urban green infrastructures within public housing (pilot site ATER Matera), through the creation of a network (Urban Green Network) on urban green infrastructure among leading scientific and institutional organisations which share a new approach on energy efficiency.
3. **COOPERATION ACTIVITIES:**
  - Urban analysis of “pilot district” of Matera
  - International and interdisciplinary-design workshop
  - Interdisciplinary experimentation
  - Study and selection of 25 native plant species

# Example: Basque Country

## Virtual common fund for SME-led interregional innovation projects

### Funding interregional SMEs-led demonstration projects, through 'Virtual Common Pot'

- Connecting (and aligning) regional/national grants programmes/instruments/budget lines
- Towards (timely) activable combinations 'fundable' activities (e.g. 1 end-user region A, 2 technology providers region B, 1 research centre region C)

### Regionally-led Decision and Funding-making processes

- Not a joint-fund; Not a centrally managed call
- Funds provided directly by the respective regional funding organisations
- 'Virtual Common pot' (no transfer, no overarching entity managing funds)
- 'Low risks' (retain control of funding decisions and funding in accordance with own standard rules and procedures)

### Additionality

- Channelling 'newly' dedicated-reserved budget lines...
- ...But not only (impacts maximizations)

### No extra fee for calls preparation/management !

- Regional in-kind contributions (evaluations, information provision)
- Pilot resources and activities activated
- VI resources and activities activated
