



- Broni Hornsbi Interreg Italy Malta. Broni has worked for many years in Sicily in the field of EU-funded research and collaboration projects, mainly focusing on innovation in environmental and Circular Economy systems. Apart from the CORALLO project, another international projects which was particularly important for the Region of Sicily, Bythos -Biotechnologies for Human Health and Blue Growth sought to kick start a new value chain using side streams from the fisheries sector. Bythos won the Juror's award and public choice award for Smart and Competitive Europe at this year's EU RegioStars award in October 2024.
- Latifa Bousselmi Interreg ENI CBC Med. Latifa is professor in Process engineering leading a team on Non conventional Water valorisation in the frames of local sustainable water management and cleaner production at the Centre for Water Research and Technologies (CERTE) in Tunisia. She is mainly involved in research and innovation (R&DI) related to water multi-uses towards zero discharge with the development and implementation of NBS and advanced technologies (AOP). She is co-founder of NGO for sustainable development « The Research in Action, REACT ».
- Lorena Sasso, Interreg Italy Slovenia. With a background is geological sciences, Lorena is project manager of the MEDS GARDEN project, under the INTERREG VA Italy-Slovenia 2014-2020 Cooperation Programme, aimed to develop and preserve the natural and cultural heritage, increasing its attractiveness, and preserving biodiversity in five educational gardens, between Mira (VE), Pordenone and Capodistria.

- Dr. Thanasis Hadzilacos. Interreg Greece Cyprus. Dr Hadzilacos works at the Cyprus Institute. He is a computer scientist who, for the past decade, has been working on Natural Disasters and the Climate Crisis at three scales: <a href="Eastern Med and Middle East">Eastern Med and Middle East</a> (international policy initiative), <a href="Interreg Greece-Cyprus">Interreg Greece-Cyprus</a> (Floods) and <a href="City Climate Neutrality">City Climate Neutrality</a> (Lemesos Net Zero Mission).
- Annelies Broekman. Interreg EuroMed. She is a researcher at the
  Water and Global Change group at CREAF, develops different projects
  focusing on improving governance strategies for adaptation in the
  Mediterranean region. Her work aims at promoting scientific knowledge
  to be taken up in management and policy making processes, adopting
  an integrated view of socioecological systems and fostering coproduction of solutions.
- Juan Terrádez. Interreg Spain, France and Andorra (POCTEFA). He
  has a degree in environmental sciences from the University of Valencia,
  master's degree in water resources management from the University of
  Cadiz. He has worked on climate change adaptation issues since 2010,
  especially in mountain areas. Since 2016 he has been working in the
  Pyrenean Observatory of Climate Change as a European project
  manager.
