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Overview

In-house video making used to be hard and expensive. As videos became more and more important with the rise of mobile devices, social media and streaming, video-making became easily accessible at any budget or skill level. This training is designed for the experts who want to make high-quality videos to promote Interreg initiatives and results.

Who is it for?

This training is open to all Interreg experts who plan to be contribute to the in-house video making in their programme. While the communication experts are the most likely candidates, this training is also useful for high-level management experts who might have to speak in front of cameras from time to time.

What will I learn?

You will learn how to produce a variety of professional-looking videos in-house.

How long does the training take?

It typically takes 14 hours (within 1 month) to complete all the components, including the short online course and the in-person training.

How do I get my certificate?

We issue your certificate when you have completed all the mandatory components of the training and have successfully completed a simple final task – submit a short video. Please note that this training involves an in-person event on 26-27 February 2025 in Alicante, Spain which you must attend.

The participants will see how to set up the essential video recording equipment, how to connect and adjust individual components before they start recording.

14.30 – 15.30 Exercise: Breaking the ice

A group of volunteers will be making their first recordings using the professional equipment. They will explain in 30 seconds what their learning objectives are for the training. We will then watch the recordings together. The objective of the session is to make the participants start adjusting to the feeling of being in front of the camera and getting over the unpleasant feeling of seeing and hearing ourselves on a recording.

The goal of the exercise is for the participants to apply the advice from the training and try to project confidence even while talking about a topic they might not be familiar with.

	All the participants will have an opportunity to record a short video using the professional equipment in the room, based on the short scripts they prepared in the previous session. The trainers will give the participants feedback and advice on how to improve.
